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Letting the Gospel Shape our Worship

As long as its gospel purpose is fulfilled, each aspect of a Christ-centered liturgy can be expressed in a variety of ways.

Indicatives: the gospel of first importance (1 Cor 15:3 onwards)

Imperatives: ways we could worship in response

Aspects of Gospel-Shaped Worship (Containers)	Ways to Express each Aspect (Components)
1. Adoration (we recognise God's character, greatness and goodness)	Call to Worship (from Scripture or extemporised) Hymn/Song of Praise (Congregational or item) Gloria (Lt: Glory), Sanctus (Lt: Holy), Doxology Responsive Reading Affirmation of Faith Creed Any combination of the above
2. Confession/Repentance (we acknowledge our character, sin and need for grace)	Pastoral Prayer Congregational Confession (In Unison, Responsive, Silent) Responsive Reading Scripture Reading Hymn/Song of Confession (Congregational or Item) Kyrie Eleison Collect Any combination of the above
3. Assurance in Christ (we affirm God's provision of grace)	Scripture Reading Responsive Reading Hymn/Song of Assurance (Congregational or Item) Sursum Corda (Lt. Lift up your hearts) Fellowship Exchange (e.g. greeting one another with expression of Christ's love and peace) Any combination of the above
4. Thanksgiving (we express our devotion and thanks for God's grace)	Regular Offering Special Collection Prayer of Thanksgiving Hymn, Song, Psalm of Thanksgiving Doxology Gloria Patri (Lt: Glory be to the Father) Personal Testimony of Praise Scripture Reading Any combination of the above
5. Petition/Intercession (we express desire for help in living for God)	Pastoral Prayer Elder-led Prayer Silent Personal Prayer Intercessory Prayers for and from Congregants (e.g. prepared prayers, prayer requests)

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	Hymn/Song of Petition Kyrie Eleison Any combination of the above			
6. Instruction (we acquire the knowledge to grow in grace)	Scripture Readings (pastoral, lay leader, unison, antiphonal, responsive, etc.) Mission, Ministry or Personal Testimony Creeds and Affirmations Baptisms Ordaining or Commissioning Church Discipline Hymn/Song of Preparation			
7. Communion/Fellowship (we commune with God and his people)	Intercessions Testimonies Fellowship Expressions and Announcements Mercy/Alms Collections Diaconal Reports Sanctus Gloria Patri Agnus Dei Creed Recitations Communion options: - congregation seated and served - congregation processing - congregation partaking as a meal			
8. Charge/Blessing (we resolve to live for and in the light of God's grace)	Scripture Reading Ordaining or Commissioning Historic or Contemporary Writing Extemporised from Pastor Benedictus (Lt. Blessed be) Gloria Patri Nunc Dimittis (Lt: Now you are dismissing) Choral Benediction Final Hymn/Song with appropriate message Exchanges of Fellowship (dismissing one another with expressions of Christ's love and peace) Any combination of the above
